

## Top Tips:

- This Route is approximately 10 miles (16km). If that is too far, there are points where you can leave the trail at convenient locations for public transport. In particular Mill Lane near Croxteth Park offers regular bus services if you are walking. The under pass of the M62 links you to Broad Green Rail station with regular trains to Liverpool City Centre and other areas of the Northwest. All trains have a cycle policy and allow you to take your bike on the train for free.
- If you are cycling, the areas between Aintree Rail Station and the path and Higher Road and Hunts Cross can be extremely busy with Traffic. Families with young children might want to wheel bikes on these sections.
- There is always plenty of wildlife to spot on the trail... see how many creatures you can find!

## *Trail Treasure Hunt - Liverpool Loop Line*

**Start from:** You can catch regular trains from Liverpool City Centre and Ormskirk to Aintree Rail Station. Leaving the station, walk across the car park where you will see Aintree Racecourse in front of you... Turn right and walk along Warbreck Moor till you see the Trans Pennine Trail Bridge passing over the road (approx 200 yards). This is the start of your journey following signs for Speke.



**How to do the Treasure Hunt:** On your way look out for the object in each photograph. When you spot it, simply answer the question next to the photograph. All the questions can be answered from the Trail, although they may be about things you can see in the distance rather than things on the Trail.

Finish: Continue following the path to Halewood Country Park and woodland, follow the signs for 'Higher Road'. Reaching the path exit at Higher Road, Turn right follow the road a short distance to Hunts Cross Rail Station where your journey ends.
